## Summary

Council is required to hold an election to fill the vacant office of Shire President, following the resignation of Cr Ventris from this position.

# Background

Shire President, Cr Garry Ventris tendered his resignation in writing to the CEO effective 17 March 2025, meeting the requirements of section 2.31 of the Local Government Act 1995 (the Act).

As a result of the resignation, Council is now required to undertake the election of a new President.

### Comment

The process for electing a new Shire President is as follows:

- The Deputy Shire President will preside over the meeting until a new Shire President is elected.
- Nominations must be submitted in writing to the CEO either prior to or during the meeting.
- The CEO will conduct the election via a secret ballot.
- Votes will be counted as per Schedule 4.1 of the Act, and the CEO will declare the elected candidate.

As Council cannot function without a Shire President, it is essential that this process be undertaken in a timely and compliant manner.
