#### 3. Presentation on Hotham Williams Sub-Catchment Council by Melanie Durack, NRM Officer

- Defined the Peel Harvey Catchment Council and the Hotham Williams Sub-Catchment history
- Explained the funding model and role of the Natural Resource Management (NRM) Officer
- Presented on projects completed in the last year in the Hotham Williams Sub-Catchment
- Presented future focus areas for the catchment

#### 4. South32 update by Gary Eyres, Worsley Mine General Manager

- Key milestones for the new South32 company formed by the demerger of BHP Billiton:
  - Analyst and investor tour of the Worsley Alumina mine and refinery on 1 May
  - Shareholder approval for demerger on 6 May
  - South32 stock exchange listing on 18 May
  - Legal day one for South32 from 25 May
- South32 has operations across five countries & 27,000 employees and contractors
- Worsley has a chance to shine as one of South32's most valuable asset
- Governed by values of care, trust, togetherness and excellence
- South32's website launched on 18 May. It will be expanded over time to include the CLC minutes, terms of reference and membership list (as agreed by members)

## **5. Worsley update by Gary Eyres, Worsley Mine Manager**

- Good safety record for the quarter
- Advised operating costs have been impacted by higher energy costs
- The mine is performing to plan achieving at or above production targets, with recent organisational changes occurring to optimise the use of equipment and people
- Annual Worsley awards recognised outstanding performance across our business
- Advised the Worsley Community Office was not well utilised by the community and will be closed by the end of June 2015

## **6. Mine and environment update by Gary Eyres, Worsley Mine Manager**

- On track to rehabilitate a record amount of land in FY2015, and good success rates are being recorded for areas previously rehabilitated
- Provided an update on the recently completed fauna monitoring program

## **7. Community update by Amanda Blunt, Worsley Community Relations**

- Provided an update on the proposed environmental community development project. The focus has been narrowed to the Collie and Hotham-Williams Catchments.
- Advised of successful March grants round recipients in Boddington, Collie and Greater Bunbury
- Advised the community grants program is on hold until the South32 model is shared. The closing date for the next round will be well advertised

## **8. Terms of Reference Review by Toni Collins, Terms of Reference sub-committee member**

- Advised the sub-committee believed the CLC was operating well, however youth and environmental representation could be better
- Discussed suggested recommendations for change – maximum number of members be capped to 20, a quorum of 10 required for a meeting to take place and membership/attendance details to be provided to new joining members
- Wider committee agreed with all suggested changes except for the quorum which will not be included

- Committee agreed to encourage nominations from aboriginal and youth sectors of the community, as well as the Hotham Williams Catchment Council

  - B Dowsett – Advised the new Shire of Wandering CEO had settled in well. Thanked the Rural Living Expo organisers for a well organised and all round great event
  - T Forbes – Provided an update on the Boddington Main Street visioning project and advised community consultation session was planned 11 June, 6pm at the Boddington Community Club. Plans were also available for viewing in the Shire of Boddington Administration Building
